MEETING IN CERVIA (ITALY)

Work Package 3: THE YOUTH IMPACT OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL CHALLENGES

I) DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES TAKEN PLACE

20/02/2023

Arrival of Partecipants from each delegation.

Welcome from City staff members and welcoming dinner.

21/02/2023

The participants arrived to the Alberghiero Institute school where they were welcomed by the students.

The European projects office of the Municipality of Cervia organised and coordinated the meeting. Simona Melchiorri, coordinator and head of the office, explained the project agenda and the objectives of the event. The councillor for schools and culture, Cesare Zavatta, together with Prof. Mattia Santoni, vice headmaster of the Institute, gave a welcoming speech to all participants.

Afterwards, the participants had their turn to make a 7-8 minute presentation on the best practises related to the main topic of the event. In fact, it has been asked to each partner to present the main social challenges related to the pandemic that have positively and negatively impacted young people. The aim of this working session was to reflect on what actions have been taken by the respective European administrations to address the social challenges related to Covid.

During the work session, class 5D of the Alberghiero Institute school was invited to participate in an interactive workshop coordinated by SERN (Sweden Emilia-Romagna Network) together with the project partners.

The aim was to involve the students in order to understand, through their valuable testimonies, what was the impact of Covid on young people, in terms of future social and economic challenges.

It was also an opportunity to learn about the initiatives that the other European partners have undertaken in order to support civic participation and avoid the social dispersion of young people during the pandemic period.

II) Project coordination

Partners debated about the project calendar of WPs, and they confirmed the following dates:

- > WP4: BUILDING A RESILIENT FUTURE OF EUROPE in Gkrte (Hungary), will be organized on 26-29th April 2023.
- > WP5: EUROPEAN YOUTH FACING ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL CHALLENGES in Farkadona (Greece) To be confirmed by the following weeks.
- > WP6: THE EUROPE THAT WE WANT in DRPDNM NOVO MESTO (Slovenia), will be organized on 11-14th September 2023.
- > WP7: WE ALL ARE EUROPE in Athienou (Cyprus)during the month of November.
- > WP8: FINAL MEETING: SPREAD THE WORD in Kalnik (Croatia) during the month of April 2024.

Once the workshop at the Institute was completed, through the coordination of the Cervia Municipality's Community Policies office, the participating delegations were able to see at first some of the works carried out by the municipal administration, together with the help of local stakeholders, related to the protection and enhancement of our territory: starting from the Milano Marittima seafront, the partners were able to appreciate the redevelopment of the area but also the function of the sand dunes, which are indispensable to preserve the bathing establishments as well as the adjacent urbanised areas.

Another activity involving the partners took place at the Social Coast radio station in Cervia, where the partners were able to give a video interview where they talked about the experience of their respective municipalities in promoting initiatives to prevent youth dispersion during the pandemic period.

22/02/2023

On the second working day, the delegations were welcomed at the Casa del Volontariato (Volunteer House), where the President of the Consulta del Volontariato (Volunteer Council), Luigi Nori, gave a warm welcome to all the partners involved together with the Councillor for Volunteering, Bianca Maria Manzi

The continuation of the activities included a group workshop on Local Green Deals with the help of the delegation of experts from SERN (Sweden Emilia-Romagna Network). In this regard, participants were invited to learn about European green strategies in order to understand their desired promotion at local level.

In the afternoon, the partecipants then visited the Cervia Salt Museum – MUSA appreciating the history of the city and Cervia's culture.
